
Thursday Night Poetry Slam!

Reservations: Kensington Court Hotel and Conference Center/Holiday Inn Express, Ann Arbor, Michigan

The conference hotel, Kensington Court, and the Holiday Inn Express are next door to one another and under the same ownership, so conference attendees can choose either option at conference rates. Both are located on Briarwood Circle, just off of Interstate 94, next to the Briarwood Mall, and about 2 miles south of downtown Ann Arbor. The Kensington Court is a luxury hotel with a restaurant, bar, pool, sauna, exercise room, and complimentary wireless. All conference events will be held in the ballroom and meeting rooms at the Kensington Court. The Holiday Inn Express has a pool, offers complimentary continental breakfast, and is located directly next door.

Directions to both hotels:



From US-23 North or South: Take I-94 West toward Chicago. Exit at State Street (exit number 177). Turn right on State Street and left at first available left turn (Briarwood). US-23 Southbound travelers should be careful not to exit US-23 onto Business 94 West or M-14 West. Stay on US-23 until you reach I-94 West.

From I-94: Exit at State Street (exit number 177). From Westbound I-94, turn right on State Street and left at first available left turn (Briarwood). From Eastbound I-94, turn left on State Street and left at first available turn (Briarwood).

There are no shuttles from the Detroit Metro airport to either hotel. Taxis to Ann Arbor cost about \$50 each way, which means renting a car might be a better deal (you could then also use the car to drive downtown rather than using more taxis or buses).
